

Curriculum Corner: Happy Birthday Dr. Seuss!

"Read Across America Week" is here! It always takes place the week of March 2nd which is Dr. Seuss' birthday! The week is a great reminder that raising a reader begins during these early preschool years. Taking time to read a variety of books is also a way you can help expand your child's horizons to different cultures, traditions, places, and ways of life. Here are some ways you can motivate your child to have a love of reading that can last a lifetime!

- * Read together everyday. It's okay to reread favorite books... repetition helps children learn.
- * Start a reading tradition, such as each night at bedtime or special books for holidays.
- * Build vocabulary by simply talking & having interesting conversations each day.
- * Visit the library and check out whatever interests your child.
- * Notice print on signs, food boxes, menus, and anywhere you go!
- * Think aloud and ask questions as you read together.
- * Connect reading to your experiences... for example, read a book that takes place in wintertime before or after you play outside in the snow.
- * Use expressive voices for characters and sound effects... have fun!!
